Dress Code

The required attire for delegates on day 1 (31st July) & 3 (2 August) is professional business clothing suitable for diplomatic settings. This includes a business jacket/blazer, formal shirt, slacks/skirt/dress, and formal shoes. To maintain the utmost professional appearance, the following items are strictly forbidden: sweaters, any form of casual jacket, shorts, sundresses, ball caps, jeans, sneakers, athletic wear, and sunglasses. Any attire deemed overly revealing or not meeting these standards will not be permitted. On Day 2 (1st August), delegates are allowed to wear ethnic clothing. After the end of all committee sessions for the day, you may change into casual attire before the proceedings of the Social Night. This casual attire should also be school-appropriate. Sharp attire will help project confidence and make a great impression on fellow delegates and staff. Please keep in mind sleeveless, noodle straps (straps must not be less than three fingers wide), off shoulder and skirts less than three inches above the knees and unbuttoned shirts are strictly prohibited. To maintain a professional and respectful environment, we kindly ask all delegates and IP members to adhere to the dress code. Should anyone need assistance to comply with the dress code, we are here to help.

Electronic Devices

All phones and smartwatches with calling capabilities must be set to silent mode during the committee sessions to prevent disruptions. Urgent phone calls should be taken outside the committee room.

The use of internet, including mobile data, for research during committee sessions is subject to the Executive Board members of the committee.

Using devices for activities unrelated to the conference during committee sessions is strictly prohibited.

All internet activity during SMIS MUN will be monitored using Smoothwall, a tool the school uses to help maintain a safe and positive online environment for everyone. We kindly ask all participants to use the internet responsibly and limit their usage to research and MUN-related purposes.

Behaviour On Campus

Delegates must demonstrate utmost sensitivity and refrain from making derogatory comments related to, but not limited to race, gender, sexual orientation, religion, age, origin, or disability.

Delegates are expected to use constructive language and avoid offensive terms both during committee sessions and in all interactions, fostering a high-quality debate and maintaining a positive environment for all participants.

To ensure a safe and respectful space, delegates must abstain from inappropriate behavior, offensive actions, or unwelcome advances, including those of a sexual nature.

Prior consent must be obtained before photographing fellow participants to respect personal boundaries and establish a trustworthy conference environment.

The use of electronic cigarettes (vapes) and traditional cigarettes, the consumption of alcohol, drugs, or other non-prescribed substances will result in immediate removal from the school campus.

Vandalism of any kind on school property, including tables, chairs, and walls, is strictly prohibited.

Consequences

SMIS MUN 2026 holds the right to revoke the issuance of a certificate if any of the above-mentioned rules are violated.

You may be asked to leave the campus if you do not comply with any of the established guidelines.

Unauthorised photography or videography will result in serious consequences, including a meeting with the principal and the delegate's parents/guardians.

Use of the internet when prohibited may result in confiscation of the device until the end of the committee session or disqualification from awards.
